Activities you can get involved in at Dove Stone

Practical peat land work including spreading sphagnum moss, re-seeding bare peat, gully blocking



Woodland work including, tree and scrub planting, propagation of plants, felling trees to increase diversity and structure

Helping look after the “Wildlife Action Zone” including filling up bird feeders, bird/bat box making, creating ‘bug houses’

Meadow work including introducing native wild flowers

Surveys of plants and animals

Guided walks (short & long) looking at the wildlife, talks, including specialist talks on peregrines



Infrastructure work including maintenance and installation of fences, walls and benches



‘A Date with Nature’ helping visitors view and enjoy watching the peregrines

Meet and greet visitors to Dove Stone making sure they enjoy their day

Spring

Introducing native wild flowers, ‘A Date with Nature’

Summer

Insect, amphibian, reptile, plant and tree surveys, hay meadow monitoring and cutting, ‘A Date with Nature’

Autumn

Felling trees, practical peat land work

Winter

Introducing native wild flowers, felling trees, scrub planting, upland and lowland tree planting, re-seeding bare peat

All Year

Filling bird feeders, bird and mammal surveys, maintenance of fences, walls, and benches, guided walks, talks, meeting and greeting visitors
