If the reader is convinced by their work it is said that the writer has achieved their goal. That is why the writer needs to know the basics of a **persuasive essay** so that they can convince the reader regarding their point of view.

On the other hand, a descriptive essay is quite different from a persuasive essay. In a descriptive essay, the writer has to describe a person, object, place, emotion, situation, or experience in front of the reader. The writer has to focus on the minor details so that the reader may clearly understand what the author is trying to portray. Descriptive and persuasive essays are the opposite of one another but the format used in both essays is quite similar. Before discussing the major differences between the two essays it is important to tell the format used in them. The format of these essays is mentioned below:



## **Introduction**

This is the first section of an essay. The writer should include all the basic information related to the topic in this part of the essay. The background and facts regarding the essay are also to be mentioned in the introduction section. The last sentence of the introduction is known as the thesis statement. The writer should write their main argument in the thesis statement and the coming section will be dependent on your thesis statement.

## **Body paragraphs**

In this part of the essay, the writer has to present all their arguments in front of the reader. Along with the claims evidence should be provided in this part of the essay. This section consists of more than one paragraph and each paragraph should discuss a separate point. In a persuasive essay, the writer should provide support for their point of view in the body paragraphs whereas in a descriptive essay the author has to give details regarding the topic which is being described in front of the reader.

## **Conclusion**

This is the last section of every essay in which the writer has to give the concluding remarks. Along with this, the writer should also mention the main arguments of the essay briefly and then provide their opinion about the topic which has been discussed.

## **Key differences between persuasive and descriptive essays**

As mentioned before, these essays have the same format but they are very different from one another. The main differences include:

### **The use of vocabulary in each essay**

In a persuasive essay, the writer has to persuade the reader hence convincing and persuading words should be used in the essay so that the reader agrees with the writer. On the other hand, the language and vocabulary used in a descriptive essay are different.
